 Exeter Culture: beyond June 2020 The current funding of the programme finishes at the end of June 2020. A recent meeting with the Arts Council articulated the achievements (multi-stakeholder buy-in, Cultural Strategy, new governance structure, UNESCO partnerships and bid, creation of the NPO network, and the emergence of other networks across the city) that EC has had a direct role in. ACE requires evidence of 'the necessity' for a continuation of EC beyond next summer. There is a need now to diversify the funding streams. Potential funding streams from the University are outlined. The importance of the heritage sector in Exeter is noted, and the work that the Exeter Heritage Partnership (led by the University's Heritage Lead) is doing in fostering collaboration – this requires a lot of development time. Some of the ELGC money could be used for EC to work on heritage networks, and ECC are keen for that to happen; NLHF is also keen. But it requires a mandate from ECC and HF. SA comments that Heritage Open Days was very successful this year – in particular, the 'Heritage Haiku' initiative, which saw involvement from a UoE academic. Development idea: a one-day-a-week funded post to coordinate activities.
